CONGRESSMAN CARR BUSY.

Congressman Wooda N. Carr, on Tuesday introduced a bill in the House looking to the establishment of the government armor plant in Fayette county. Although personally favoring Masontown, the congressman in his bill asks the appointment of a commission to visit the county to report on the most suitable location. This commission would be appointed by the Secretary of the Navy, and would consist of three members, the presiding officer to hold the rank of rear admiral.

The board is to make a report to the Secretary of the Navy as to the suitability of sites examined, taking into consideration cost, original cost of plant, cost of manufacture, facility of distribution, etc.

"A number of towns in Fayette county, through their boards of trade, have started movements looking to the establishment in their limits of the government armor plant," said Mr. Carr. "Point Marion and Masontown, on the Monongahela river, and Connelville and Uniontown are candidates for the honor. They all have strong argument in the proximity of coke, for that is the fuel that is required in making armor, and would be right at their doors. The shipping facilities, both by rail and water, are good, and we wish to have the sites looked over by naval officers."

DEER FOR BABCOCK TRACT.

Windber, Jan. 27.—E. A. Diethrich and C. B. Knepper, of this place, have been named to take charge of the ten does sent here by the State Game Commission from the famous preserve at Westover, and which will arrive here at 10 o'clock Wednesday morning. The does will be taken to the Babcock Forestry Reserve, where E. V. Babcock several years ago turned 18 bucks loose. William Murphy, of this place, believes the deer should be placed further down on Shade Creek, but the original plan for their location will probably be carried out. With the three-year ban on killing deer in this region in force, hunters look forward to fine venison hunting in 1917.

Fifteen more does are to be sent a little later. Local sportsmen have made all arrangements for feeding and protecting the deer.

Port Au Prince, Haiti, Jan. 28.—Armed detachments of American sailors from the armored cruiser Montana were today on guard at the American legation, the cable station and the French hospital. German bluejackets and marines were placed on protection duty at other foreign legations and at the German stores in the city.

Landing parties were sent ashore from the American and German war vessels yesterday when President Michel Oreste fled for refuge to the German cruiser Vineta after fighting broke out in the streets of the capital.

POULTRY NOTES

Healthy chickens need no medicine or stimulants.

Reading, breeding, feeding and care will bring success to most any poultryman.

The henhouse should be very carefully cleaned during the hot weather of early fall.

Give the fowls plenty of pure, fresh water, and wash their drinking dishes every day.

For head lice, sweet oil rubbed in is not so harsh as kerosene but just as effective.

Nothing makes a cooler, cleaner-looking poultry house than the use of plenty of whitewash.

The surplus sour milk can be utilized in no more profitable way than by giving it to the hens.

Carefulness in dressing poultry pays for the extra pains taken. The pinfeathers must all be removed.

In applying insect powder, hold the fowl by the feet, head down, and work the powder well into the feathers.

Over-exercise toughens the flesh of even a young fowl. A good breast is half the race for a valuable table fowl.
