The body of Mrs. Ernest Welfley,

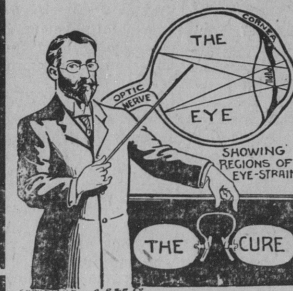
