OPEN LETTER ON RIGHT TO TRAIN DOGS

My dear Sir:

We are frequently in receipt of inat this time relatve to the right of those who may own dogs to turn them loose to run as they please at this time of the year. Some these inquiries come from the ownare opposed to dogs, and for the beneat of both, I quote the Law in so far as game is concerned, a part of Secas amended by the Act of April 15th,

1915, P. L. 133, which reads as follows "Provided, That dogs, when accompanied by and under control of their masters, may be trained upon any of the living wild game or birds of the first day of Septemer to the first day of March next following, so long as no injury is inflicted upon said animals or birds."

The dog must be with his master must be under the control of such master, and the game pursued must not be injured. Dogs cannot be turned out to run at large, under penalty of death of the dog at the hands of a Game Protecter, when such dog is caught pursuing game or injuring in violation of the provision Under the provisions of the Act of June 3rd, 1915, P. L. 791, dogs even at any time by the owner of killed found, or by the employe of such owner, unless the dog shall have atto his collar the tax tag described by the Act, and the owner shall have no recourse at Law in either

CAN PRESERVE EGGS

WITH WATER GLASS It is during the spring of the year then eggs are plentiful that they should be "put down" or preserved for winter use. Water glass has been to be the best means of pre servation

Only fresh, clean eggs should be us ed and they should never be washed. Crocks, jars, and galvanized fron or wooden vessels may be used. Crocks, are considered best. An vessel used should be clean and sweet and wooden vessels should be thoroghly scalded before eggs are packed in

The liquid rather than the powdered form of water glass is preferable. The home economics extension department of the Pennsylvania State College School of Agriculture and Experiment Station recommends using one part of the liquid water glass to ten parts of water, It is advisable to boil the water. When the solution has cooled the eggs should be placed in as they are gathered and the vessel containing eggs and solution stored in a cool place. There should always be one or two inches of solution above the eggs.

The solution made from one quart

of water glass will preserve about twelve dozen eggs.


