Uniontown, April 21.—Allen Foster Cooper, former Republican Congressman from the Twenty-third District, composed of Somerset, Fayette and Greene Counties, dropped dead in the garden of his home here last evening. He was 54 years of age. Mr. Cooper served as a permanent chairman of the Republican State Convention in 1905, and had been a member of congress for four terms.
