Finding a dynamite cap, Joseph Radzawicz, seven years old, of Shenandoah, commenced to pick it with a nail, and his left hand had to be amputated.

Miss Nellie Murry, of Lost Creek, a graduate nurse of the training school for nurses of Kings County hospital, New York, has enlisted in the base hospital unit.

Bathing after a hearty supper, Harry Himmelberger, aged nineteen, Lebanon, was fatally stricken with paralysis of the heart, in Swatara Creek, Valley Glen Park.

Easton school board increased the salary of Superintendent Robert E. Laramy from \$3000 to \$3500, and the salary of Secretary R. E. Peifer from \$1500 to \$1600.

Frederick Turner, aged sixty-nine, veteran Pennsylvania railroad engineer, was found dead in Kittanning a block from his home. Death was due to heart disease.

A loose plank hurled William Bachert, of Quakake, John Boland, Jersey City, and their motorcycle into the lake at Lakeside, but fishermen rescued them from drowning.

The skeleton of Boris Conat, aged twenty-seven, who disappeared from Conditale six weeks ago, has been found in the mountains near Tamaqua, with \$60 in the clothing.

Judgment was rendered in favor of Miffilin county by Justice D. C. Hamaker in the suit instituted by J. Harry Sides, one of the county auditors, for \$39 alleged to be due him.

Driving a horse for the first time, Mrs. G. S. Sutton, near Bloomsburg, figured in an ugly runaway, in which she suffered a fractured collar-bone and her daughter ugly bruises.

Because so many parents have been imploring him to spare their sons, B. W. Wilde has notified Governor Brumbaugh he doesn't want to serve on the Hazleton draft exemption board.

Commissioner John Price Jackson, of the state department of labor, has been appointed a major in the engineering section of the officers' reserve corps of the United States army.

Kittanning's police force, with the exception of Chief William Gallagher, is on strike. Joseph Glenn, E. E. Perry and G. I. Cousins, patrolmen, quit work after demanding a wage increase.

To fill vacancies in Bloomsburg council, caused by the resignations of William V. Moyer and James H. Coleman, Columbia county court has named Dr. T. C. Harter and E. M. Savidge.

First Deputy State Highway Commissioner Joseph W. Hunter has notified township supervisors of the second class to file their annual reports with the state highway department before August 1.

Walking in her sleep, Mrs. Austin Conlin, aged eighty-four, of South Bethlehem, who is deaf and blind, fell from a second-story window into a geranium bed, but escaped without serious injury.

Claude Conner and William Bell are in the Berwick hospital, in a serious condition, from injuries received when their automobile turned over after colliding with another from Wilkes-Barre.

The Lehigh Valley Railroad company notified its employees that the pass privilege will be greatly restricted on account of the war, and no half-rate transportation will be issued for pleasure trips.

Traveling at eighty miles an hour down a steep grade on a motorcycle near Carlisle, Paul Bailey and Walter Horst, of that place, were thrown thirty feet at a stone wall, and yet neither was badly hurt.

Placing his head on the rail in the path of a fast Pennsylvania passenger train, a man believed to be John Bishney, address unknown, was fatally injured near Greensburg. He died before the train reached there.

Captured in a battle along the Somme, William Carter, aged twenty-three, of Uniontown, is being held a prisoner at Zrbyest, Germany. With other men he is compelled to work in the fields and elsewhere in aid of the Kaiser's government.

A movement has been launched at Conneleville by Harry Dunn, former captain of Company D, N. G. P., to raise a fund to provide members of Company D and the hospital corps of the Tenth regiment with luxuries while at the front.

Fire in the plant of the Sheffield Glass Bottle works at Sheffield, near Warren, caused a shut-down of the plant for about a week. Half of the roof of the plant was burned off and seventy-five employees thrown out of their regular employment.

In an effort to get a piece of ice from an ice cream container, Leona Myrel Christopher, aged two, daughter of Oakey Christopher, of York Run, near Uniontown, plunged head first into the water and ice and drowned before being discovered by her mother.

Discovering two men attempting to force an entrance to his residence near Smithton, John Laterbaugh, a farmer, killed one of the men in a gun battle that lasted half a hour. The dead man was August Cairant, aged thirty, address unknown. The other man escaped.
