My Views on Raising Funds for the Prosecution of War to Bring World Democracy.

A direct income tax on all persons, regardless of race, color, sex, creed, or social or political standing, to be levied annually, as follows: For the first \$500 or fraction thereof, 1-4 of one per cent; second \$500 or fraction thereof, 1-2 of one per cent; third \$500 or fraction thereof, 3-4 of one per cent; fourth \$500 or fraction thereof, 1 per cent; all over \$2,000 to be at the service of the Government as long as necessary to continue the world war for democracy.

As a red card member of the Socialist Party for ten years, this is my present view of a practical method for raising necessary funds, and for a practical demonstration of patriotism.

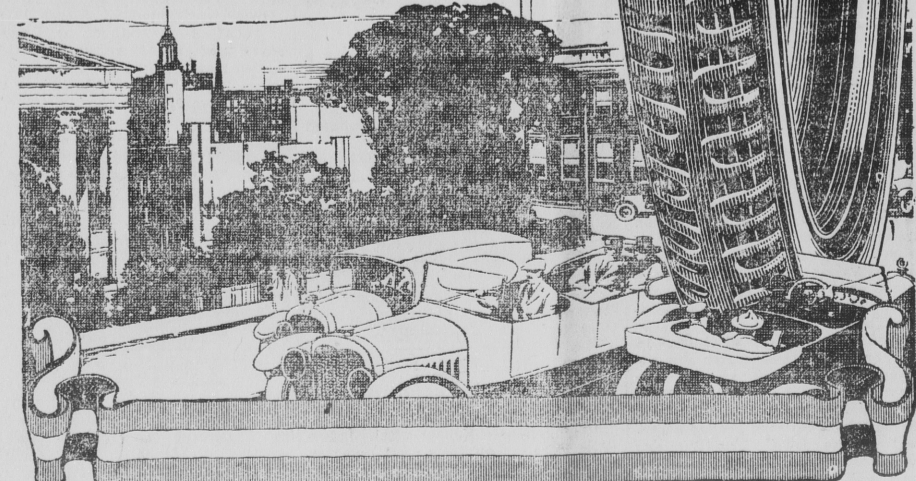
