Dr. Joseph Parry, the great musical composer, and Director of the South Wales School of Music, died on Tuesday. Nothing is known on this side of the Atlantic as to the nature of the malady which carried off the famous man.

Mr. Parry, who had married just about this time, was not financially able to bear the expenses incidental to a course in the Royal Academy, but his friends in Danville and a few neighboring towns came to his rescue.

On the occasion of his graduation he was signally honored, Mrs. Gladstone at her request was permitted to present him with his diploma.

During the fall of 1889 Dr. Parry with a quartette of artists of the very first order came to America and gave concerts in the first cities of the country.
