READY FOR STILL HUNT

Republicans Prepared to Block the Democracy's Game. NEXT TUESDAY ELECTION DAY. Young Men Are Volunteering All Over the State to Work to Get Out the Republican Vote, As Did Many Who Became Great Leaders.

Philadelphia, Oct. 27.—With election day but one week off, Chairman Penrose, of the Republican state committee, has practically completed his work of this campaign, and for the remaining days of the contest the whole responsibility of the canvass has been shifted to the members of the county committees, the members of the various precincts and the other active workers throughout the state, upon whom the organization depends to get the vote to the polls.

While Chairman Penrose and Secretary Andrews will remain at headquarters until after the returns are in, they are now sending out their last batch of mail and that they have no doubt that the committee rooms are being laid off, as all their work has been done.

THE DEMOCRATIC STILL HUNT. It is true that the Democrats of Pennsylvania have not for years been so demoralized and absolutely without organization as that they have not undertaken to put up a fight in the open during the canvass this fall. But it is also true that this fact has led to apathy in the ranks of the Republicans.

THE DEMOCRATIC WORKERS know that if there shall be a large Democratic vote polled in Pennsylvania, it will be a hardly small Republican vote in the election returns from this showing.

THE STAY-AT-HOME REPUBLICANS are little less than assistant Democrats, and it is to the stay-at-home Republicans that the party organization in this campaign is being urged to direct most attention.
