The toilet room on the first floor of the Gillaspys was slightly damaged by fire, Sunday morning. The blaze was discovered at about 10 o'clock.

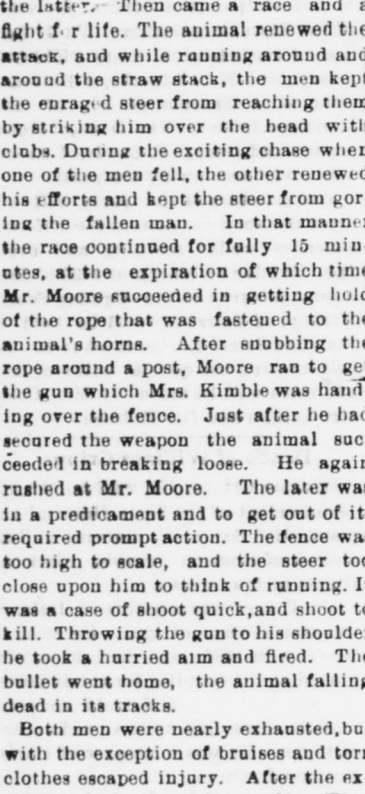

New License Law

The bill introduced by Senator Godcharles in the Senate provides that in each judicial district containing less than five hundred thousand population the governor shall appoint three ex-officio commissioners. They are to hold office for five years and shall be paid salaries based on the population of their respective districts, as follows: Less than 400,000, \$250; less than 100,000, \$500; less than 200,000, \$700; more than 200,000, \$1,000, with mileage and other expenses. The salaries and expenses are to be paid by the counties. After next January the powers conferred upon the courts of granting licenses is transferred to the ex-officio commission. The commission shall conduct public hearings of applications for licenses, having authority to issue subpoenas, etc. From any final order or decree of the commission granting or refusing to grant an appeal may be taken to the Supreme or Superior courts. The bill makes no change in the present system of filing and publishing applications, filing of remonstrances, conduct of hearings, regulations of the sale of liquor and punishing violators.
