ANNUAL STATEMENT OF Y. M. C. A.

Owing to the fact that the Young Men's Christian Association is without a General Secretary at this time, it has been deemed advisable to hold the anniversary exercises, as in former years; but, in order that the public may be in possession of some important matters relative to the Association, the retiring General Secretary, William D.
