

FOUND DEAD IN BED.

MR. HENRY SCHERER'S SUDDEN DEATH YESTERDAY MORNING.

Another Death Resulting From Excesses in the Flood—The Awful Scenes Nightly Repeated and Caused Sleeplessness—The Fatal Remedy.

Mr. Henry Scherer for years before the flood resided on Portage street, opposite the Gaultier Works. The family consisted of Mr. Scherer, his wife, three daughters, and a son. The flood of May 31, 1889, swept their home away, and Mrs. Scherer and two of the daughters, Emma, aged twenty-three years, and Mary, aged eleven, were drowned. The bodies have not been recovered.

After the flood Mr. Scherer got to boarding in Cambria borough, and the past two or three months, and at the house of Mr. John Miller, No. 824 Chestnut street, now the Sixteenth ward. For about two months he has not been at work, having been afflicted with rheumatism. He formerly worked at the Gaultier Works and later in the blacksmith shop of the Cambria Iron Company.

On Saturday he came up to the central part of the city and drew some money out of the bank and called at Dr. Zimmerman's drug store about 2 o'clock p. m., and asked for something to make him sleep. He told the doctor he was not able to rest at night, and frequently saw many of the terrible sights witnessed at the time of the flood. During the nights he imagined he heard his wife and children calling for him to save them.

The doctor put up some chloral and bromide of potassium in a two-ounce bottle—about one hundred and twenty grains of chloral. He told Mr. Scherer to take a teaspoonful of it before retiring and if he did not go to sleep to repeat the dose every three hours. He cautioned him about the use of the drug and wrote the directions on the bottle in German.

After he returned to Cambria he paid some small bills he owed there, and is believed to have gone to his room about 6 o'clock in the evening. Between 10 and 11 o'clock Saturday night Mr. Michael Weiz, aged about twenty-two years, who boards at the same house and occupied the same bed with Mr. Scherer, retired to his room. He says about 3 o'clock Sunday morning Mr. Scherer got up and went to the window and then got back to bed. In the morning he was awakened at 7 o'clock and found that Mr. Scherer was dead. The bottle that had contained the chloral was found empty sitting on the window-sill. It is thought that he was unable to sleep and that the visions of the great flood were appearing before him, and that in the hopes of getting sleep and rest he drank the contents of the bottle. Thirty or forty grains under ordinary conditions would be enough to kill a man.

Twenty-five years ago Mr. Scherer had a shoemaker shop on Clinton street, on the present site of the Conemaugh Valley Furniture Company, and was considered at that time an expert workman. He was a native of Klenner, Prussia, and came to this country over thirty years ago. He was aged fifty-six years last August. About twenty-six years ago he was married to Miss Catharine Fox, who, as was mentioned, was drowned in the flood. A daughter and a son survive; the daughter, Miss Lena, is employed in Mr. Scott Dibiery's shoe store, and makes her home with her aunt, Mrs. A. Danges, a sister of the deceased. The son, Harry, has made his home with his aunt, Mrs. Martin Fox, on Centre street. Mr. Fox was drowned in the flood and was a brother of his mother. There are also surviving him a sister, Mrs. Henry Kurtz, of Baltimore, and a brother, Carl Scherer, of Evansville, Indiana.

Mr. Scherer was a member of the German Lutheran Church and the Harmonie Singing Society. The funeral will take place this afternoon, at 4 o'clock, from the residence of Mrs. A. Danges at 56 1/2 Market street.

Death of Capt. W. R. Jones' Mother-in-Law—Braddock Daily News.

Mrs. Mary Ann Lloyd, mother of Mrs. Charles Robertson and Mrs. Capt. W. R. Jones, departed this life at the age of eighty-two years, after a long and painful illness, at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. Charles Robertson, Stewart avenue, North Braddock. Wednesday, April 16th, at 4:30 o'clock. Mrs. Lloyd was born 1807, in Tipton, Staffordshire, England. She came to this country in 1850 with her mother. Her father and two sisters preceded them two years, settling in Boston, Mass. About 1854 Mrs. Lloyd and her husband went from Boston to Pottsville, Pa., where, with two other capitalists, he built the Fishback mill, now the Pottsville Steel Works, and becoming disgusted with the management of the mill, they returned to Boston in 1862. From there they removed to Johnstown, Pa., and from there they came to Braddock about fifteen years ago.
