The Senate of the State of Washington ananimously passed an anti-Pinkerton bill. The Alabama State Senate has reconsider. ed its vote of last Tuesday and on Saturday passed a bill giving an annuity of \$500 to Mrs. Jefferson Davis. It now depends on the lower house whether the bill becomes a

Eighty Mon Killed and Scores Injured by an Explosion of Gas in a Mine in Bohemia. An explosion of fire damp occurred in the Fortschritt mine, at Dux, in Bohemia, lighty miners were killed and scores in-jured.

jured. The explosion occurred when the shifts were charcing. A cage full of miners (had been lowered half way down the shaft when a loud rumbling report was heard, and the cashe attached to the cage broke and the cage and its occupants fell down the shaft. Ten of the men were killed instantly, lo suffering fr ct rees from which they cannot recover and huve have broken limbs and the ternai injuries, but will live. They had been half suffocated by the gas rising in the shaft and said that no maan could live be-low.

shaft and said that no man could live be-low. An hour later the superintendent of the mine and five miners went into the mine. They were inable to go more than 100 yards into the gallery, but they found 14 dead bodies. Of the 30 men who were waiting for the cage. 10 had been killed and 40 par-tially crushed by falling timbers or half sufficated by the foul air. It is believed 40 men at wo kin the gallery were also killed by the explosion.


