MILLIONS FOR SOMERSET.

Coal People Paying out Big Sums of Money There—Oil Said to be Flowing Beneath Her Wooded Hills.

A. A. Stutzman, who is associated with Judge Keim in Somerset county coal land transactions, was in town, Wednesday. He is busy with paying off the farmers whose coal rights have been bought, and Mr. Stutzman says he settles with from two to four people daily. Farmers receive generally from \$2,000 to \$8,000, and as the syndicate represented by Mr. Stutzman has optioned between \$10,000 and \$50,000 acres at \$10 to \$20 per acre, it can be seen that an immense amount of money has been distributed among the Frosty Sons of Thunder. And yet the work has apparently only fairly begun. It will take a year or more for Mr. Stutzman to finish paying off the options he has taken.
