ANOTHER ANTI-QUAY VICTORY.

The Machine Loses Everything in Luzerne County - The Fusion Movement Growing - Chester County Will Send a Full Fusion Ticket to the Legislature Next Fall - The Big Fight is Now On.

Harrisburg, July 10.—The entire state of Pennsylvania has been suffering from intense heat during the past week, moderated by brief intervals by local showers. The fact that the farmers are in the midst of harvest and that the weather is oppressive and torrid does not prevent the active politician from making things lively throughout the commonwealth. In nearly every county where primaries are to be held, indeed where they have been held, a vast deal of quiet political work is being done.

FUSION IN CHESTER.

It is more than likely that there will be an equal division of legislative offices in Chester county, the Democrats taking two members of the legislature and the Republicans one. Ex-Representative Plummer E. Jeffers, Republican, has been practically agreed upon as the fusion candidate for state senator in opposition to State Senator Snyder, who is one of the principal cogs in the Quay machine. Professor Rendall, Republican, will also be a candidate for the legislature again. The four fusion members of the legislature in Chester county in the last session were among the most representative men sent to that body in any county.

DR. COPPE'S ULTIMATUM.

At the recent conference between the dairy and food commissioners, Jesse K. Coppe, of the committee sent by the Pure Butter Protective Association, with an offer to co-operate in the enforcement of the law. Coppe dictated what he styled an "ultimatum" to the committee.

THE PURE BUTTER PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION.

The Pure Butter Protective Association is to submit a list of the cases which they desire the dairy and food commissioner to assume. The list is to give: "First. The name and address of the person charged with violating the law. Second. The Character of the sample. Third. The date on which the sample was taken. Fourth. The name and address of the agent who collected the sample. Fifth. The name, address and will report of the chemist who analyzed the sample. Sixth. The total expense incurred by the agent. Seventh. The total expense incurred by the association. Eighth. Any additional expense. The dairy and food commissioner will examine the list so submitted by the association and if in his judgment he will take a prosecution. It is understood that no attorney fees are to be included in the list of expenses submitted. The Pure Butter Protective Association will in the future furnish information as to the violators of the law to the dairy and food commissioner and will direct his agents to make investigations, and if the suspicion is well founded to take sample and send it to the chemist for analysis. If the case is found to be one suitable for prosecution suit will be ordered. It is further understood that the Pure Butter Protective Association is not to involve the department in any expense for future cases."
