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

New Postage Stamps A new set of designs for the United

States postage stamps of the series of States postage stamps of the series of 1902 is being prepared at the bureau of engraving and printing in Washing-ton. A new stamp will be added with a value of 13 cents to facilitate the foreign register letter business. In

the new series the stamps will have an arch over the picture, with the words, "United States of America" and will supplant "United States postage." The word postage will appear at the bottom before the denomination value of the respective stamps.

A picture of Grant will be printed upon the 4-cent stamps instead of that of Lincoln, which will be given the 5cent stamp, upon which the likeness of Grant now appears. Martha Washington will appear upon the 8-cent stamps instead of Sherman, while the new 18cent stamp will bear a likeness of Ben-jamin Harrison. The \$1 black stamp will have the head of Farragut instead of Commodore Perry, as at present. The remaining denominations will re main unchanged. The special delivery stamp will carry representation of a messenger mounted upon a bicycle, and will be printed in red, instead of a

messenger running. The new McKin-ley postal cards are now on sale.

Hanna's Heavenly Hash.

The corned beef hash which was the eature of breakfast given at Senator Hanna's home in Washington to Presi dent Roosevelt and other magnate was greatly relished by the guests, and has become famous. The recipe for preparing it is as follows: Equal parts of boiled prime corned beef and pota-toes are cut into tiny cubes. A small onion is minced to add flavor, and the bottoms of the dishes are rubbed with a head of garlic. Another garlic head is wrapped in a piece of fat and thorwn into the center of the mass. The whole is then mixed thoroughly and nicely browned in a big skillet or frying pan. During the operation disks of Bermuda onions cut so that each round shows every ring of the onion are thrown into a deep dish of pure lard and browned delicately. When these disks are crisp they are used to garnish the edge of the platter, and the hash is served
