TO COMPLETE SOUTH PENN. Pennsylvania Railroad are Said to
Have Decided on Have Decided on That Move.
Connensville Courrier. There is talk of completing the South
Penn railroad on which the Vanderbilt interests a number of years ago spent
$\$ 20,000,000$. The line would have been $\$ 20,000,000$. The line would have been
a competing one for the Pennsylvania

Now the Pennsylvania have use for the road. The South Penn road is admit-
ted to be the natural route across the

the Cumberland valley to a point near
Newville. Then it took a straight course across the State, passing through
Fulton, Bedford, Somerset and Westmoreland eounties, thence to Pittsburg,
connecting with the West Penn Division. Eight or ten long and expensive
tunnels were required in the work. Some of these were partially completed
and the road about half finished when the Pennsylvania and the Vanderbilts
reached an agreement that resulted in reached an agreement that
abandoning the project.
The partially eompleted tunnels are
in good condition and it is said by railin good condition and it is said by rail-
road men that the South Penn could be
completed in liss the completed in less than three years.
Pennasyrania officials are not disposed to confirm the reports, but the admit
