### Plan to Import Girls.

Secret investigations which have  
been carried on for some time by res-  
cue mission workers throughout the  
country, says a Chicago dispatch, have  
brought to light the existence of a syn-  
dicate which has been organized for  
the purpose of importing girls to St.  
Louis during the World's Fair.

The disclosures already made lead to  
the belief that the promoters intend to  
return to the methods employed in the  
days of the "white slave" and that  
agents are in rural towns offering al-  
luring inducements to girls.

The investigators assert that the St.  
Louis syndicate is endeavoring to ob-  
tain 60,000 girls from country towns  
and villages. Its agents are also work-  
ing in Europe and will send thousands  
of women across the water. The com-  
pany, it is asserted, has \$100,000 capital  
behind it.

Church papers throughout the coun-  
try are preparing to take up the in-  
vestigation and give it the widest pos-  
sible publicity, so that the agents will  
be marked when they invade the coun-  
try districts.
