

PRUNING ROSES.

Everblooming roses, the trees, are benefited by a good pruning. If cut back to about six inches of the old wood, strong new shoots start out and furnish abundance of bloom. In the more northern States the plants are usually winter pruned, i. e., they freeze down quite closely to the ground; in that case all that is necessary is to cut away the injured portion. Further south, where the wood is not frozen, the bushes should be cut back about one-half. Hardy roses bloom better for more moderate cutting. Yellow roses scarcely ever need any pruning.
