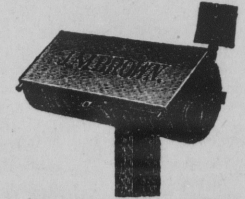

NORTH DAKOTA DOINGS.

ZION, June 4, 1904. EDITOR STAR:—The severity of the past winter and the tardiness of our spring season are about forgotten by us, and while the Russian bear is fighting the Japanese yellowjackets, the "Flickertails" of North Dakota are so intent on finishing their spring sowing that they live almost oblivious of their surroundings. Although our season was comparatively late, not much seeding having been done in April, May, with the exception of a few days, was a very favorable month, and the farmers have made rapid progress ever since.

The conditions of the soil never were better, we have an abundance of moisture, germination is perfect, the stand good, and the growth very vigorous at the present time, as we are having plenty of rain to keep up the supply of moisture. In the Northern half of the state the acreage of wheat is very much larger than in previous years, as very little flax has been sown. In the Southern half they claim the wheat acreage is about 15 per cent. less, but the percentage of corn is very much greater than formerly.

There is also considerable corn planted, this year, in the Northern tiers of counties. One of my neighbors said he was going to put out 80 acres, others planted less, more as a matter of experimenting. I planted a small patch of your Little Yellow Dent Seed that I got from my nephew, Sam. Enos, near Rockwood. It's up nicely, ready to plow, but I can easily cultivate it with the hoe, as I am a "man with the hoe." I use a light sharp hoe instead of a cane, so whenever I take a walk out over my fields and run onto a nest of weeds, I can soon play havoc with them.

By the time this may get into print, our crops will all be in, and the farmers can take a short season of rest, go on excursions, attend conventions, again read their papers, keep posted on the political issues and the war news, be ragged and "sassy," or spruced up and trim, jolly and gay and exultantly sing:

"Ye may sneer at the farmer, yet he's king of the earth. At whose royal command its abundance comes forth To millions who wait throughout the broad land, And he nourisheth all by the turn of his hand.

Behind all the toilers in furnace and mine, And wonderful project and mighty combine, The tiny seed sown by the farmer's hard hand Is the power that controls in this vast, teeming land.

Then sneer if you will, while your mills grind his grain, He rules o'er ye all through hamlet and plain; Sustaining your life by his labor and toil, The farmer stands first, for he's king of the soil."

Value of the Bob White.

The ornithologists of the Department of Agriculture at Washington have been making an investigation of the economic value of the bob white, or common quail, as a result of which it is now announced that that bird is "probably the most useful abundant species on the farm." Field observations, experiments and examinations show that it consumes large quantities of weed seeds and destroys many of the worst insect pests with which farmers contend, and yet it does not injure grain, fruit or any other crop. It is figured that from September 1 to April 30, annually, in Virginia alone, the total consumption of weed seed by bob whites amounts to 573 tons.

Some of the pests which it habitually destroys, the report says, are the Mexican cotton ball weevil, which damages the cotton crop upward of \$15,000,000 a year; the potato beetle, which cuts off \$10,000,000 from the value of the potato crop; the cotton worms, which have been known to cause \$30,000,000 loss in a year; the chinch bugs and the Rocky Mountain locust, scourges which leave desolation in their path and have caused losses to the extent of \$100,000,000 in some years. The report urges measures to secure the preservation of the bob white in this country.
