Of Special Interest to Farmers.

This locality is blessed this year with an enormous crop of apples, and the best possible use should be made of the fruit. Many farmers never reap the full benefit of a good apple crop, thus losing a great deal of money. Some will say: "Oh, apples are so plentiful this year that we can hardly give them away!"

That may be the case in this locality at present, but do you ever hear of anyone giving applebutter away? No, indeed; because there is always a good market for it.

Apples are seldom a big crop all over the country in the same season, and good applebutter is an easy seller at any time. Take a look at the market and see how wheat has taken a jump upward. Just as sure as wheat is up in price, applebutter will follow.

Good applebutter isn't hard to make if the right material is used. Your selection of cider apples matters but little, just so the fruit is free from decay, leaves and dirt. But the filling or

sauce apples should be of the best flavored varieties in your orchard, as they contribute more to the flavoring of the applebutter than the cider apples do.

If your cider apples are tartish, be sure to use sweet apples for filling, and be sure to have your filling apples thoroughly clean and sound, if you want fine flavored applebutter.

If farmers act upon these suggestions, they can turn a nice lot of ready cash into their pockets each year that they do not otherwise get.

ON THE BRINY DEEP.

Items of Interest From a Passenger on Board the Steamship Celtic.

Early in July THE STAR announced that J. A. Berkey, the well known and popular attorney and Republican leader, of Somerset, would set sail for Europe on Aug. 5th. Mr. Berkey took his departure as per announcement, and on Tuesday, the 22nd inst., the editor of this paper was much pleased to receive a personal letter from him that was written the day before he landed at Queenstown, Ireland. Believing that certain portions of the letter will interest our readers, we take the liberty to print the following:

STEAMSHIP CELTIC, Aug. 11, 1904. Ship time, 4:20 p. m. Somerset time, 1:10 p. m.

DEAR LIVINGOOD:—I saw no land since leaving Sandy Hook, 2:30 p. m., Aug. 5th.

Rough weather Sunday; many sick, but over it now. I have not been sick a minute, nor have I missed a meal. Saw no sail until yesterday, when we sighted four steamers and one sailing vessel, the latter flying Swedish flag. Others were too far off to recognize.

I give home and steamship time, as I carry two watches.

Our sailings have been as follows: Aug. 5th, 333 miles; Aug. 6th, 377; Aug. 7th, 379; Aug. 8th, 389; Aug. 9th, 390; Aug. 10th, 392; Aug. 11th, 393; total, 2,653.

We reach Queenstown Saturday morning. We slow up to-morrow afternoon, so it takes us more than a day to make remaining 350 miles.

We have our final jubilee to-night. I enclose a program. You will see I am in politics here, too; got an office.

Had one death, and one man went crazy and was put in the lockup this afternoon, as he became dangerous. We have had some births aboard; all this has been in steerage.

I will return on the Majestic. Passengers who have rode her say she is much faster than Celtic, but does much more pitching and rolling.

We have had a very fine voyage. I am sorry you are not with me. The trip has been pleasant.

I expect to visit Blarney Castle, Sunday, and kiss the Blarney Stone. It is four miles out from Cork. Irish on boat say it is hard to reach the stone, but I am going to kiss it if other fools can.

I send Bishop a letter for publication, as he requested it. You will get some of my voyage in his number of about Aug. 25th.
