Price 50 ets. **Eighty-Seven Miles of Cable.** A cableway, which will he the long-est in the world, and will have the highest engine station yet existing, is shortly to be installed on the Argen-tine side of the Andes by a German engineering firm. This cableway will extend from Chileeto, on the Argen-tine Nothern railroad, which is 3,430 feet above the sea, for a distance of 22 miles, to a point 14,933 feet above the sea level, or 1,300 feet higher than the summit of the Jungfrau. It will cross a chain of rocks and preed-pices, spanning, in some places, chasms nearly 3,000 feet wide and more than 600 feet deep, while at other points it will be supported by iron towers 130 feet high. All tho material will have to be taken to its destination on the backs of mules. The length of the cable rope will be 87 miles. 


