The Middle Pennsylvania Penitentiary is created by a bill introduced by Mr. Flynn, of Elk county, in the House of Representatives at Harrisburg, on Wednesday, of last week, which bill provides for the appointment of a commission of seven to select a site for the penitentiary and appropriates \$15,000 for the purpose. The bill cites the overcrowded condition of both the Eastern and Western Penitentiaries, and asserts that for historical reasons the former should not be removed from Philadelphia, its present location. These counties shall comprise the Middle district within which the new penitentiary shall be erected: McKean, Elk, Clearfield, Cambria, Blair, Bedford, Cumberland, Adams, Potter, Cameron, Clinton, Fulton, Centre, Huntingdon, Mifflin, Perry, Juniata, Franklin, Tioga, Lycoming, Union and Snyder.

What It Costs.

"In going to law you are a loser if you win," said a disgusted litigant the other day after having lost a suit in which he was concerned. This idea is emphasized somewhat by a reference to the recent cross-suits from Boswell. Besides the great expense to the county, the court costs to six of the prosecutors and defendants runs over \$800, as follows: Ferd Sann, \$181.92; Ed. Keane ("not guilty but pay the costs") \$154.11; Robert Lochrie ("not guilty but pay the costs") \$222.73; William Boyle, \$81.50; Martin Blueas, \$176.24; Steve O-haski, \$20.35. In addition to the above, private counsel was employed in the cases, so it must be evident that it requires at least four figures to state the costs of a fight brought on to see "who is who."—Standard.

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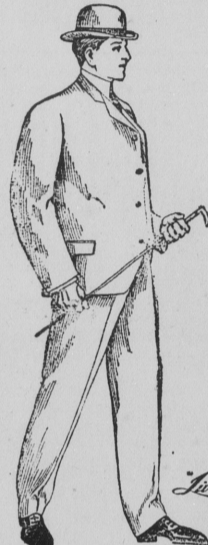

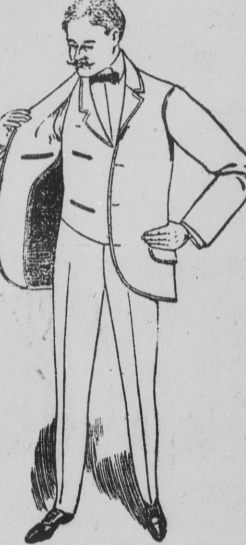
