FINANCE AND TRADE REVIEW

DUN'S WEEKLY SUMMARY

Several Scales Signed Calling for Higher Wages and General Prosperity Continues.

R. G. Dun & Co.'s "Weekly Review of Trade" says: Wholesale conditions are maintained in commercial channels, the tenor of most reports being favorable.

Several scales have been signed that provide for higher wages after this month, and the general prosperity of the winter is believed to assure a very large retail trade in spring wearing apparel.

Manufacturing returns from the leading industries continue favorable, the weekly feature being record-breaking sales of leather, while the steel mills and iron furnaces operate at full capacity.

Exports of farm staples in February exceeded last year's by \$23,500,000, or about 45 per cent.

Railway earnings for the first week of March were 8.9 per cent. larger than last year's.

Failures numbered 229 in the United States, against 250 last year, and 34 in Canada, compared with 26 a year ago.
