Indelible Blue Ink.

Indelible Blue Ink.

The French scientific papers give these directions for a blue ink that will resist not only water and oil, but alcohol, oxalic acid, alkalies, and chlorides. It is prepared by means of four parts of shellac, two parts of borax, two parts gum arabic, and sufficient indigo to give the desired color. The whole is dissolved in 40 parts of pure water. Commence by putting the shellac and the borax in 35 parts only of the water in a closed receptable and boiling until completely dissolved. Filter, and then dissolve the gum arabic in the remainder of the water. Mix the two solutions and heat for five minutes, stirring from time to time. Add the indigo after the liquid is cool. When the preparation has settled for a few hours, decent in order to separate the ink from the sediment.
