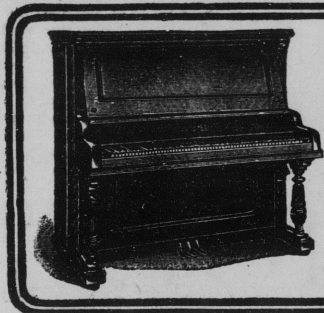

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR CHARTER.

Notice is hereby given that an application
will be made by C. H. Jennings, George
W. Kipp, D. D. Clark, E. F. Kizer, H. H.
Maust, John M. Wright, J. L. Barchus, Miel
E. Lilley and Guy H. Davies to the Govern-
or of Pennsylvania on the 7th day of June,
1906, at 10 o'clock, a.m., under the provisions
of the Act of Assembly entitled "An act to
provide for the incorporation and govern-
ment of Street Railway Companies in this
Commonwealth," approved May 14th, A. D.
1888, and the amendments thereto for an in-
tended corporation to be called "Pensyl-
vania and Maryland Street Railway Com-
pany," the character of the object of which is
the construction, maintenance and opera-
tion of a street railway for public use and
the conveyance of passengers by electric
power, the location and route of the same
being as follows, viz:--
Beginning at the edge of the Borough of
Somerset where Main Street crosses the
bridge over Cox's Creek in the Township of
Somerset; thence along the Somerset and
Bedford Pike to the plank road; thence
along said plank road through the Town-
ships of Somerset and Brothersville to the
Borough line of Berlin; thence by said
plank road to Main Street; thence over
Main Street to Cross Street; thence over
Cross Street to Spring Avenue; thence over
Spring Avenue to Borough line; thence
over public road through the Townships of
Brothersville and Berlin to the Borough
line of Garrett; by way of Beachdale; thence
along Walker Street to Adams Street (Bor-
ough line of Garrett); thence over Adams Street
and private right of way to the public road
on the East side of Buffalo Creek in Sum-
mit Township; thence over said public road
along the East side of Casselman River to
the Borough line of Meyersdale; thence
along said plank road to Grant Street;
thence over Grant Street to Dale Street;
thence over Dale Street to Cross Street;
thence over Cross Street to Thomas Street;
thence over Thomas Street and private
right of way to the public road near Borough
line; thence along said public road leading
to Salisbury by way of Boynton Bridge over
the Casselman River to a point near the
borough line of Salisbury; thence over a
private right of way to Gay Street; thence
over Gay Street to Union Street; thence
over Union Street to Depot Street; thence
over Depot Street to Iron Bridge at the
Borough Line of Salisbury; thence return-
ing by parallel track to the place of begin-
ning.
And for these purposes to have, possess
and enjoy the rights, benefits and privi-
leges by said Act of Assembly and suppli-
ments thereto conferred.

LOS ANGELES LETTER.

**Dr. A. F. Spelcher Denies Harmful
Reports Concerning the City He
Resides in.**

LOS ANGELES, CAL., May 19, 1906.
EDITOR STAR:—In view of the harm-
ful reports circulated by eastern pa-
pers of an earthquake, a tornado, a
tidal wave and other such imaginary
visitations in Los Angeles, I want to
say that this is incorrect, and detri-
mental, not only to our own city and
Southern California, but to San Fran-
cisco and the entire state as well.

Let it be understood that Los An-
geles is all right and unharmed. Not a
single straw has been misplaced, and
there was no more disturbed than any
other city in the United States.

It is true that on the day following
the earthquake in San Francisco there
was a slight tremor here in Los An-
geles, but it was so slight that it was
noticed by many. Personally, I did
not feel it at all. The fact is, there was
some disturbance over the greater part
of the country. It is stated, the shock
was felt in Washington, D. C.

Many people who have not been in
California have an impression that the
whole state is in a ten acre lot with
San Francisco in the center. But you
must remember it is a vast territory—
a big state, and Los Angeles is approx-
imately five hundred miles from San
Francisco, or about as far as Boston or
Chicago is from Salisbury. It has not
affected the business or progress of our
city at all. It was a terrible catastro-
phe, but you must not forget the fact
that the fire did about four-fifths of the
damage.

We all sympathize with the stricken
people of the north, and were the first
to extend a helping hand. It is mar-
velous the way the entire country re-
sponded to send material aid to the
sufferers.

Other large cities have had their
fires, floods, cyclones and tornadoes,
and have arisen from them in more
splendor and grandeur, and more sub-
stantially than they were prior to the
disaster. Even so will San Francisco
be rebuilt. In all the history of South-
ern California, extending back to the
days of the Franciscan Frthers, about
a century and a half, there has not
been a serious earthquake in this re-
gion.

A disaster similar to that of San
Francisco may never occur again in
any part of the United States. I hope
it may not. It is as liable to occur in
Boston, New York or Philadelphia as
on the Pacific Coast.

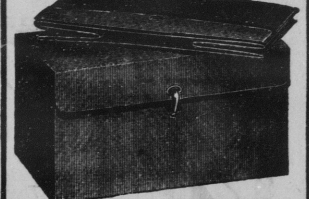

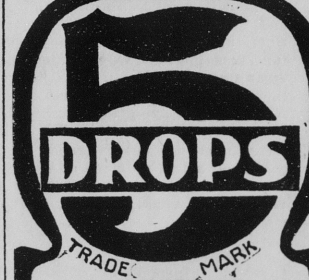
