

### A LESSON FOR MONTREAL.

#### No Smallpox in Cleveland, Ohio, and No Vaccination.

To Dr. Friedrich, in charge of the health board of Cleveland, Ohio, is due the credit of furnishing the civilized world with an example of a large city being absolutely free from smallpox. One of the first means he adopted in producing this result was to abolish vaccination entirely.

Dr. Friedrich says in one of his reports: "It affords me great pleasure to state that the house-to-house disinfection freed Cleveland from smallpox. The disease raged here uninterruptedly since 1898. We relied upon vaccination and quarantine as the most effective weapons to combat it, but in spite of all our efforts it doubled itself every year, and was in a fair way of repeating the record of last year, as in 1900 we had 993 cases, and from Jan. 1st to July 21st, 1901, the number amounted to 1,223. Vaccination had given us many untoward symptoms. Frequently it did not take at all. One-fourth of all cases developed sepsis instead of vaccinia. Some arms swelled clear down to the wrist joint, with pieces of flesh as big as a silver dollar and twice as thick, dropping right out, leaving an ugly, suppurating wound, which to heal took in many cases over three months. Finally four cases of tetanus developed after vaccination, so that the people became alarmed, and rightly so."

Reader, can you, in the face of such testimony as this, given by expert medical authority, continue to sit supinely by, swallow the lying statements of the vaccination quacks, and not bestir yourself to do what you can toward the repeal of Pennsylvania's odious and damnable vaccination law, which was passed through and by a set of conscienceless medical sharks? It is up to the freemen of Pennsylvania to call a halt upon the medical grafters and blood-poisoners. Vote only for legislative candidates pledged to do all in their power to have the said law repealed at the next session of our Legislature. Let our Somerset county readers remember that J. W. Endsley and Amos W. Knepper have pledged themselves in public print to do all in their power to have the compulsory vaccination law repealed. You will find their names on the Republican ticket when you come to vote, and if you want your God-given rights returned to you, and the charlatans in the medical profession to be given a much needed setting down, be sure to vote for them.
