The United States Secret Service announces the discovery in Chicago of a new counterfeit \$5 silver certificate, series of 1899, Lyons, register, Treat, treasurer. It is a crudely executed process note on a single piece of paper, slightly thinner than the genuine, with the fibre imitated by red and blue ink marks on the surface. The work is blurred. The note is said at the Treasury, will not deceive expert handlers of money, but is sufficiently dangerous to impose on careless or inexperienced persons.
