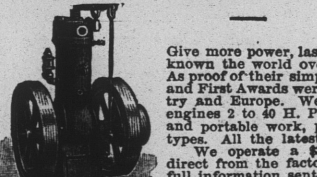

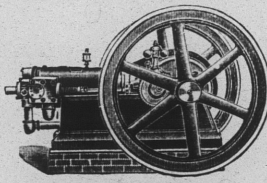

AN ORDINANCE

Relating to the Grading of a Part of Grant Street, in the Borough of Salisbury.

SECTION 1.—Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Salisbury, in the County of Somerset and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the grade on the East Side of Grant Street in said Borough of Salisbury, from Broad Lane to Mechanics Street, be and the same is hereby established as follows: Beginning at the curb line at the southeast corner of Grant Street and Broad Lane, at the present grade of said streets, thence along said curb line on the east side of Grant Street, descending 1.886 ft. per hundred for a distance of six hundred and fifteen (615) feet, thence descending .96 ft. per hundred for a distance of seven hundred (700) feet, thence ascending .74 ft. per hundred for a distance of three hundred (300) feet, to the southeast corner of Grant and Mechanics Streets. Said grade being fixed according to the survey and plot prepared by G. L. Benford, Civil Engineer. Ordained and Enacted into a law this fifteenth day of January, 1907.
