Section 1—Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Salisbury, in the County of Somerset and State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the grade on the East Side of Grant Street in said Borough of Salisbury, from Broad Lane to Mechanics Street, be and the same is hereby established as follows: Beginning at the curb line at the Lane, at the present grade of said streets, thence along said curb line on the east side of Grant street, descending 1.886 ft. per hundred for a distance of seven hundred (700) feet, thence along and curb line on the dast side of Grant street, descending .74 ft. per hundred for a distance of seven hundred (700) feet, thence ascending .74 ft. per hundred for a distance of three hundred (800) Mechanics Streets. Said grade being fixed according to the survey and plot prepared by G. I. Benford, Civil Engineer.
