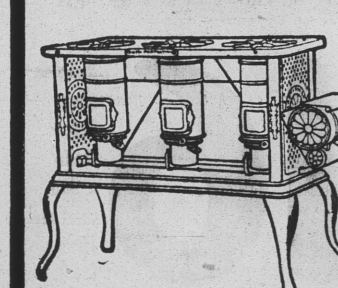

**An Insult to Army and Navy.**  
When the Commander-in-Chief of the United States Army is asked as President of the United States to approve the proposed constitution of the new State of Oklahoma he will find therein the following stipulation: "No officer, soldier, or marine of the regular army or navy of the United States shall be entitled to vote at any election in this State, provided that this section shall not be construed to include members and officers of the State militia." This provision is a gross insult to the army and navy, and a wicked invasion of the rights of every retired soldier and sailor who may now or hereafter reside in the State of Oklahoma. There are within the limits of the new State many retired officers and men of the army who have large property interests and have done much to prepare the Territory for the dignity of Statehood, yet it is here deliberately proposed to subject these citizens and subject them to the injustice of taxation without representation. The adoption of the above-quoted clause by the constitutional convention of Oklahoma has provoked widespread indignation.—Army and Navy Journal.

**Arc Lights on Trains.**  
Western railroads have begun to plan the installing of arc electric lights on passenger trains de luxe. These are to be operated on a battery of 50 cells, which will prevent fire or explosion following a wreck. The use of the incandescent electric lights on trains was regarded as a distinct advancement, but the arc lights glow with a light so much whiter and softer that they will be adopted by progressive lines. A test made in Chicago during the week by one of the railroads was entirely satisfactory. The battery is ample for a 50-hour run.

**Land Values in New York.**  
Trinity Building, just north of the old churchyard, in Broadway, New York, pays returns on a valuation of \$5,000,000. In 1857 the land with the building on it, which stood until a few years ago, was bought for \$200,000. Farther up Broadway, for the site on which the Astor House stands with the original building on it, Jacob Astor paid \$60,000. The land alone is now worth \$3,000,000.

### FINANCE AND TRADE REVIEW

**WEATHER HAS EFFECT**  
Manufacturers Continue, However, Vigorously to Prepare for Future Activity.

R. G. Dun & Co.'s weekly review of trade says:  
Weather conditions have again dominated trade, but reports have become irregular, some sections still complaining of unfavorable temperature, while most dispatches reflect the brighter results of tardy sunshine. It is noteworthy that manufacturers continue vigorously preparing for future activity, regardless of any temporary interruption to distribution by the weather.

The only idle machinery is reported at footwear factories, where spring deliveries are about finished and fall contracts have not yet arrived freely. In the aggregate a very limited part of the nation's producing power is inactive, and most of the idle machinery is due to the scarcity of labor.

Pig iron cannot be produced with sufficient rapidity in this country to meet the requirements of steel mills, more Middleborough iron being imported, despite a further advance in foreign quotations. Prices of all forms of iron under steel are strong, and some sales of pig iron for delivery during the last half of the year were made at \$22, valley furnace, against \$21 only a few weeks ago. Structural steel is wanted in great quantities for bridges, and at the leading cities there are many office buildings and factory extensions that will take all the mills can produce for months.

Pressure for merchant pipe has been so great that some mills have closed their books except at substantially higher quotations. The plate mills are sold up to the last quarter. Conditions are unchanged at New England footwear factories except that eastern wholesale houses have placed more fall contracts but most plants operate little more than two-thirds capacity.
