Prizes were then offered to the farmer bringing in the best load of grain or the handsomest baby, and the bargain day was extensively advertised in the surrounding country, the names of the merchants and their special sales being in all cases stated. The farmers responded in a most gratifying manner, and the merchants were well pleased with the plan. The idea has already been carried out in several places.


