New Court House for Garrett County, Md.

The Commissioners of Garrett county, Md., our southern neighbor, last week let the contract for the erection of a new court house to cost \$60,982, exclusive of the plumbing, heating and lighting, which is to cost \$5,882 additional.

W. A. Liller, of Keyser, W. Va., has the contract for the erection of the building, and A. D. Naylor & Co., of Oakland, Md., for the plumbing, heating and lighting.

The building will be ninety-six by one hundred and twenty feet, in the shape of a cross, with three floors, exclusive of the basement, the latter being planned to accommodate the heating plant and necessary coal bunkers, toilet rooms and storage vaults for old records and papers.

The structure will be of light colored pressed brick, with stone trimmings, slate roof, and the dome covered with copper.
