We were real lonesome to see him, and the older we get the more fondly our minds dwell on the good old days when we used to work in the woods together. Our object in going to the east end of the tunnel was for a two-fold purpose—to get a good glimpse of the grand mountain scenery, and to spend a pleasant hour with Mr. G. H. It was our first meeting with Mr. Bowman, who has been a faithful employe of the B. & O. railroad for 17 years, but we had heard of him as being one of the best fellows to be found anywhere, and we believe it.
