Centennial at Somerfield.

Somerfield, July 22.-This village will e one hundred years old next January, and it is proposed to celebrate the event with some appropriate exercises. Somerfield was a conspicuous place on the national map long before some of the larger towns in Somerset county were thought of. In the prime days of the National Pike many of the country's most eminent men passed through the village, and frequently they stopped at the local tavern for a day, or perhaps longer. General Washington, whom every school boy knows as "the father of his country," passed about ten days in this vicinity.

It was while General Braddock's troops passed through Somerset county in June, 1755, over a route laid out by Washington, that General Washington became ill at Somerfield, and he was forced to remain in camp here. General Washington participated in the battle that marked General Braddock's defeat, though he was so ill that he could scarcely sit in his saddle.
