The Automobile Terror.

Though the newspapers chronicle ccidents and fatalities resulting from the automobile craze, they do not begin to touch upon the real terrorism of this fad. Country and city alike are its victims. Sane and cautious devotees of the auto there are, of course but there are too many brutes abroad in them, and it is high time that the authorities grappled with the problem these fat-headed marauders present to the community. These are they who consider it the height of superiority to break speed laws and ignore the rules of the road. The pedestrian, the occupant of the ordinary vehicle, and the householder along the route have no rights which these honking highway nen feel bound to respect

The only way to deal with them is to arrest every offending specimen of this arrogant and reckless gentry that the officers of the law can reach, and then fine them to the limit. If they will not listen to warnings let them be harried at every turn and punished for every infraction of the letter of the law until at least a little common prudence is pounded into their pocketbooks. It is useless to appeal to their sense, for they haven't any. It is ridiculous to talk of their consciences, for they do not appreciate the meaning of the word. It is folly to reason with a flippant fool who ignores the rights of others and recognizes no higher power than gasoline and gold.
