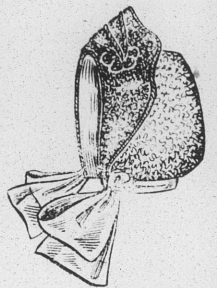
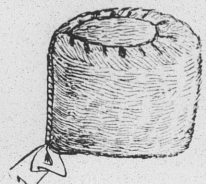
### Examinations of Rocks and Minerals.

Many samples of rocks and minerals are sent to the United States Geological Survey for examination or analysis, and as a rule visual examinations of these are made and their results are briefly reported to the persons sending the specimens. Chemical analyses of rocks, ores, or minerals received in this way are not made, however, unless the specimens appear to be of peculiar scientific interest. Analyses for purely commercial purposes or in strictly private interests must be obtained from commercial chemists.

The energies of the chemical laboratory of the Survey are devoted to examinations needed in connection with the official work of the geologists, and to comply with all the outside requests received would manifestly be impossible as well as undesirable.
