 DEAR SIR:—I read your open letter. You are the man for me. The liquor traffic is next door to hell. We can see the evils of it right here in New Baltimore.

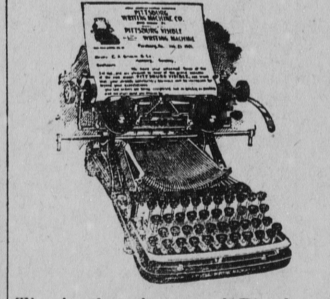
