Candidate Livengood's Platform.

Three of the largest associations of hickory users in the country, the National Wagon Manufacturers' Association of America, the Carriage Builders' National Association, and the National Hickory Association have completed a series of cooperative tests with the United States Forest Service, and the trade considers the results highly important. The tests covered a close study of the properties of different woods used in vehicles and implements, supplemented by mechanical tests to accertain the relative strength of different woods and different forms of construction, and to test the accuracy of the present system of grading.

In a report of the tests made by H. B. Holroyd, forest assistant, and H. S. Betts, engineer in timber tests, of the Forest Service, the fact is brought out that there is an error of over 50 percent, in the grading of vehicle stock, due largely to the prejudice of the manufacturers against the use of hickory. It is shown that in clear stock, weight for weight, the manufacturers, it is hoped that much of the hickory which was formerly left as waste in the woods will be utilized by the trade, and thus prolong the rapidly disappearing supply of hickory.

Such practical results as are given in the report, which a letter to the Forest Service at Washington will secure free for any one who wishes it, show conclusively the value of such studies in solving problems connected with the grading of stock, the utilization of new for old woods, and the conserving of our future supply of timber.
