No Longer Needed In These Days of

Mireless Telegraphy.

An admiralty official the other day confirmed the statement that the British naval pigeon service was to be allowed to fall into disuse. "Think of it!" he remarked. "Not so very many years ago people were filled with wonderment that a homing pigeon could fly with messages at the rate of sixty miles an hour and reach its destination with safety. Today a wireless message can be sent at the rate of hundreds of miles in a few seconds.

wireless message can be sent at the rate of hundreds of miles in a few seconds.

"It was a wise step to establish, as the admiralty did, a carrier pigeon service in connection with the navy; they are equally wise to abandon the stations now that telegraphic facilities have been brought to such a state of perfection.

"Nowadays a battleship can easily keep in wireless communication with Rame Head, near Plymotith, while voyaging to Gibraltar, or even to portions of the Mediterranean. Most of the fleet have the necessary installations aboard.

"The raval pigeon service had its drawbacks, birds often not finding their way home through losing their reckoning or on account of injury. Only in minor ways has their usefulness to the navy been demonstrated. Without wireless telegraphy, however, there is no question that in time of war they would have been a real help."

Among pigeon fanciers there was some consternation, especially on the part of those who belong to what is known as the volunteer carrier pigeon service, which is not, however, to be interfered with. Should Governments-Support All Children?

By W. E. CURTIS.

The British Parliament is expected The British Parliament is expected to pass an act granting a pension of \$1.25 per week for every man and woman, rich or poor, lazy or industrious, drunk or sober, in the United Kingdom who passes the age of sixty-five years. When their grandfathers and grandmothers are taken care of in that way, the labor unions and other socialistic organizations will insist that all children fourteen years and under shall be supported by the public treasury. and Canning Interests.

R. G. Dun & Company's "Weekly Review of Trade" says:
"Sentiment is more cheerful because of good weather for farm work and higher prices for securities. Actual progress in commercial channels is very slow, but there is a little improvement each week, while evidences of an early spring have stimulated sales of seasonable wearing apparel in most jobbing and wholesale departments. Many manufacturing plants have increased forces, especially the factories that supply farming implements and the canning industry.
"Some reductions of wages are an nounced to take effect on April 1, and thus far no serious strikes are threatened. Building permits in February showed a large decrease as compared with the same month last year, but most of the loss was at New York.
"Small grains are recorded in some departments of the iron and steel industry, while other lines remain unchanged. The best news this week comes from the branches that supply farming and canning interests, which show a seasonable tendency toward increased activity. Tin plate mills are resuming, production now failing little below normal in this division, and specifications are appearing that have been held back for some time. Merchant steel is quiet.

"A considerable percentage of cotton mill machinery continues idle, but it is encouraging to note that many New England manufacturers refused to sign an agreement to cut down production 25 per cent for three months, indicating confidence by some in an early return to normal conditions.

"New England shoe manufacturers report the quiet trade that is customary all season, but it is believed that light stocks of jobbers will soon need replenishing."

And still farther, if it is proper and lawful to furnish lunches at school recess to poor children, why is it not equally proper and lawful to furnish them breakfasts and dinners?

In certain sections of London and several of the provincial cities of England noonday meals are both at public and private expense. Last year the Salvation Army, which never gives anything away, on the theory that too much generosity creates pauperism, sold 350,000 children wholesome lunches of bean soup and bread for a ha'penny, or one cent in our money, each. These meals are furnished from wagons that drive up to the schools in the poorer districts at recess time. The men in charge dip out generous portions from enormous kettles as the children bring their buckets, plates, cans, sardine boxes, tin pans, bowls and every other sort of receptacle they can obtain.

Every child is expected to have a copper ready to pay, but many a time the rule is broken when some poor little hungry urchin has lost his coin or his drunken father and mother have failed to give nim one.

Similar lunches of wholesome, but of the cheapest materials, such as fish and potato pie, hash made from the cheapest cuts of beef, mixed with rice and vegetables, pea soup, vegetable soup and other healthful and savory food are served to school children in the manufacturing towns during the noonday recess, either free or In certain sections of London and

There is already an act of Parliament authorizing school authorities to feed children who are insufficiently nourished at the public expense and to levy a tax of a penny a pound on residential and business property to pay the cost. There is a clause in the act authorizing the prosecution of parents who fail to provide nourishing food for children that are being educated at the public expense, but I cannot find any report showing that this provision has ever been enforced. The Government of Great Britain, as well as the Government of the United States, is spending a great deal of money to improve its breeds of horses, cattle, sheep, swine and poultry; to increase the productive power of its soil and the quality of its crops of grain, vegetables, plants and flowers. 


