The meeting was poorly attended not on account of a lack of temperance sentiment in this community, but because many people suspicioned that the meeting would be a meeting not so much in the interest of a good cause as in the personal interest of a few candidates that were slated by a committee made up partly of Democrats and Prohibitionists, who have undertaken to force a slate upon the more than 8,000 Republican voters of Somerset county. Many were heard to say that they would attend no meeting held in the interest of a slate set up for Republi-cans by a combination committee dom-
