QUARANTINE

To Approve the Plan of Organization of the Board of Health of Salisbury Borough, Somerset County, Pennsylvania, and the Sanitary Regulations Adopted by Said Board.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Council of the Borough of Salisbury, Somerset County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the following plan of organization and the rules governing the same by the Board of Health of Salisbury Borough, Somerset County, Pennsylvania, and the following Sanitary Regulations proposed by said Board, be and the same are hereby adopted and approved.

SEC. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Approved and adopted by the Town Council, June 3rd, 1908.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF SALISBURY BOROUGH, SOMERSET COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

In compliance with the provisions of the act of Assembly, approved May 11, 1893, the Board of Health of the Borough of Salisbury, Somerset Co., Pa., does hereby establish and formally declare the following Rules and Regulations.

RULES.
RULE 1. The stated meetings of this board shall be held on the last day of each month. The annual meeting shall be held the first Tuesday of January, of each and every year.
RULE 2. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.
RULE 3. The duties of the officers shall be those set forth in the act of May 11, 1893.
RULE 4. The salary of the secretary shall be \$300 per quarter, payable quarterly.
RULE 5. The salary of the health officer shall be \$1200 per quarter, payable quarterly.
RULE 6. To alter any rules herein set forth shall require a motion, at two regular meetings before adoption, to be adopted by a majority vote of the board.

REGULATIONS.
SECTION 1. Any and every person who creates, continues, or maintains any nuisance, so adjudged by the Board of Health, within this Borough, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance, and shall be liable for the expense of the abatement and remedy thereof.
SEC. 2. No house refuse, offal, garbage, dead animals, decaying vegetable matter, or organic waste substances of any kind shall be thrown on any street, road, ditch, gutter or public place within the limits of this Borough, and no putrid or decaying animal or vegetable matter shall be kept in any house, cellar, or adjoining outbuildings or grounds for more than twenty-four hours.
SEC. 3. All stables and pig-pens must be kept in a clean and sanitary condition. All accumulations of manure shall be disposed of as to prevent noxious odors. Not over two loads of horse or cow manure shall be allowed to accumulate on any premises within the Borough limits.
SEC. 4. No privy vault, cesspool or reservoir into which privy, water-closet, cess-pool, stable or sink is drained, unless it is water-tight, shall be constructed, dug or permitted to remain within fifty feet of a stream or other source of water supply. Earth privies or earth closets, with no vault, pit or depression below the surface of the ground, must have sufficient dry earth or coal ashes used daily to absorb all the fluid part of the contents.
SEC. 5. All privy vaults, earth vaults, earth privies, cesspools, or reservoirs, as above named, shall be cleaned at least once a year.
SEC. 6. The following diseases are hereby declared to be communicable, and dangerous to the public health, viz.: Actinomycosis, anthrax, bubonic plague, cerebro-spinal meningitis (spotted fever), chicken-pox, cholera (Asiatic or epidemic), diphtheria, epidemic dysentery, erysipelas, German measles, glanders (arcy), hydrophobia (rabies), leptospira, malarial fever, mumps, pneumonia (true), puerperal fever, relapsing fever, scarlet fever, scarlet rash, smallpox (variola, varioloid), tetanus, trachoma, trichiniasis, tuberculous typhoid fever, typhus fever, typhoid fever, and yellow fever, and shall be understood to be included in the following regulations, unless certain of them only are specified:
SEC. 7. Every physician who shall know that any person requiring his or her services professionally, is suffering from any of the above named diseases, shall forthwith make report in writing to the Board of Health, upon blanks to be furnished for that purpose by the board.
SEC. 8. The report personally signed by the physician shall be dated, and shall state the occupation, country, nativity, age, sex, color, street address of the patient, the disease from which the patient is suffering, the date of onset, the name and occupation of the household, the number of the school children living in the house, and the school attended.
SEC. 9. Whenever any household knows that any person within his family, or household has a communicable disease, dangerous to the public health, he shall immediately report the same to the Board of Health, giving the street and number, or location of the house.
SEC. 10. Upon receipt by the Board of Health of a report of the existence of any of the following diseases, one or more placards bearing the name of the disease shall be placed in a conspicuous place or places upon the premises within which the disease appears, viz.: Mumps, chicken-pox, cholera, diphtheria, German measles, measles, epidemic cerebro-spinal meningitis (spotted fever), scarlet fever, smallpox, typhoid fever, and whooping-cough.
The following diseases require absolute quarantine: Bubonic plague, cholera, leprosy, smallpox, and yellow fever, and quarantine shall be continued until raised by an authorized agent of the Board of Health.
Absolute Quarantine includes first, absolute prohibition of entrance to or exit from a building or conveyance, except by officers or attendants authorized by the health authorities, and the placing of guards, if necessary to enforce this prohibition; second, the posting of a warning placard stating the name of the disease in a conspicuous place or places on the outside of the building; third, the prohibition of the passing out of any object or material from the quarantined house or conveyance; fourth, provision for conveying the necessities of life, under certain restrictions, to those in quarantine.
The following diseases require modified quarantine: Epidemic cerebro-spinal meningitis, diphtheria, measles, scarlet fever, and relapsing fever.
Modified Quarantine includes first, prohibition of entrance and exit, as in absolute quarantine, except as may be authorized by members of the family authorized by the health authorities to pass in and out under certain restrictions; second, the placing of a placard as before; third, isolation of patients and attendants; fourth, prohibition of the carrying out of any object or material, unless the same shall have been disinfected.
The wage-earner only is allowed, under modified quarantine to continue work, provided he at no time comes in contact with the patient, and that he has an outer room set apart where he can change his outer

clothing and disinfected exposed surfaces. Such person shall not be employed, in an establishment maintaining the production, sale or manufacture of fabrics, candy, food products or cigars. If so employed, he shall have the privilege of leaving the premises after taking an anti-septic bath, and having his clothing disinfected, and shall thereafter remain away from the premises up to the time of the recovery of the last patient and the disinfection of the household.

The period of quarantine in cases of diphtheria, shall be 21 days from onset; of scarlet fever, 30 days from onset; but no case shall under any circumstances be released until the physician has certified in writing, that desquamation has entirely ceased; of smallpox 30 days from onset, to which shall be added in each case such additional time as may be necessary in the opinion of the attending physician, for the complete recovery of the patient.

SEC. 11. Members of any household in which chickenpox, mumps or whooping-cough exists, shall abstain from attending places of public amusement, worship or education, and, as far as possible, from visiting other households.

SEC. 12. No child or other person belonging to, or residing with the family, or any person residing in the same house, in which any person may be located who is suffering from cholera, smallpox, scarlet fever, typhus fever, yellow fever, relapsing fever, diphtheria or leprosy, shall be permitted to attend any public, private, parochial, Sunday or other school, and all principals, Sunday school superintendents or other persons in charge of such schools, are hereby required to ascertain and ascertain such children and persons from said schools for a period of 30 days, following the discharge by recovery from the disease, or his or her removal to a hospital, and the thorough disinfection of the premises, and, as far as possible, from other persons, as aforesaid, before being permitted to attend or return to school, or to any other school, or to any public school in charge of said schools a certificate signed by the medical attendant of said school, or by any other person designated by the health authorities of this Borough, setting forth that the thirty days mentioned in this section have fully expired.

SEC. 13. No child or other person who is suffering from epidemic cerebro-spinal meningitis, whooping-cough, measles, German measles, mumps, or chickenpox, shall be permitted to attend any public, private, parochial, Sunday or other school; and all principals, Sunday school superintendents or other persons in charge of such schools, are hereby required to exclude any and all persons from said schools, until such persons have received a certificate signed by the medical attendant of said school, or by any other person designated by the health authorities of this Borough, setting forth that the thirty days mentioned in this section have fully expired.

SEC. 14. No child or other person who is suffering from any of the diseases mentioned in this section shall be re-admitted to school at the end of the period of quarantine, unless he has been exposed to the sick for that length of time, and has been examined by a physician, and actually affected with the following diseases, viz.: Cholera, typhoid fever, typhus fever, scarlet fever, smallpox, relapsing fever, typhoid fever, and yellow fever, and shall be re-admitted upon the physician's certificate, certifying that the person is free from the disease, and that such child has received a certificate of recovery and request for discharge.

SEC. 15. No person shall within the limits of this Borough, carry or remove from one building to another any patient affected with any of the communicable diseases dangerous to the public health. Nor shall any person, by any exposure of any individual so affected, or the body of such individual, or of any article capable of conveying contagion or infection, or by any negligent act connected with the care of the body, or by a needless exposure of himself or herself, cause or contribute to the spread of disease from any such individual or dead body.

SEC. 16. The body of a person who has died of any of the diseases mentioned in this section, shall not be buried or interred, until it has been examined and certified by the health authorities, extending the time during which the body may remain unburied, if special and satisfactory cause shown. The head of the family, and the person or persons having charge of the funeral of such body, shall be responsible for any violation of the provisions of this section.

SEC. 17. All services held in connection with the funeral of the body of a person who has died of any of the diseases mentioned in this section, shall be private, and the attendance thereof shall include only the immediate adult relatives of the deceased and the necessary number of adult pall bearers, and any advertisement of such funeral shall state the cause of death. The head of the family, and the person or persons having charge of said funeral services shall be responsible for any violation of the provisions of this section.

SEC. 18. All services held in connection with the funeral of the body of a person who has died of any of the diseases mentioned in this section, shall be private, and the attendance thereof shall include only the immediate adult relatives of the deceased and the necessary number of adult pall bearers, and any advertisement of such funeral shall state the cause of death. The head of the family, and the person or persons having charge of said funeral services shall be responsible for any violation of the provisions of this section.

SEC. 19. Any person or persons who shall violate any section or part thereof, of the regulations and rules of this section, shall be fined not less than ten (\$10) Dollars nor more than Fifty (\$50) Dollars, and the costs of the proceedings therefor, with costs, shall under no circumstances be paid by the defendant.
