**Robbery at Kantner.**

Last Thursday night burglars broke into the station at Kantner, near Stoyestown, and among other articles stolen was Mr. Berkeley's suit case, containing a gold watch, a suit of clothes and other things. His loss was about \$75.

**Seven Rabbits Cost \$13.04 Per.**

Joe Pascho, a Windber foreigner employed at mine No. 38 of the Berwind-White Company, received a salty sentence when he faced Justice Colborn, last week, on charges of killing rabbits out of season and hunting without the necessary license required of all foreigners unnaturalized. Pascho was arrested after some difficulty, by Officer McMullen, with but one solitary rabbit in his possession, but after his arrest it developed that he had been in the habit of making numerous hunting trips recently, and it was proven to the satisfaction of the justice that he had killed at least seven rabbits within the last few days. A fine of \$10 and costs for each rabbit was levied against the fellow, which, with a fine for hunting without a license, brought the total bill in the neighborhood of \$95. Pascho will serve 95 days in the Somerset county jail unless the money is paid.
