LIKINS IN SALISBURY.

His Meeting a Laughing Stock—Speaker Regarded as Disgusting Freak.

As per announcements posted last week on about every telephone pole in town, "Windy Bill" Likins, the Prohibition aspirant for a seat in Congress, appeared in Salisbury, yesterday, and in the evening delivered one of his characteristic street harangues to a fair sized mixed audience made up largely of women and children who were anxious to view the features of a red-headed freak from the tobacco fields of old Kentucky. Some of them expected to see a man of gigantic stature and noble features, knowing that fine horses and big men are bred in that state, but they knew not that a Kentucky jackass was no different from the common run of jackasses, until they viewed the one who did the braying at last night's street meeting.

"He brayed in A and Z and Q, And several other letters, too." But it is conceded by all who heard him that he made not a single vote for himself, while some believe that he lost for himself a few by his rambling, senseless and abusive harangue. His address did not consist of explained doctrines of the Prohibition party, or of any arguments in its favor, but was composed of a tirade of abuse against Congressman Cooper, the churches, Judge Van Swearingen, Pete Livengood and others. Much of it also consisted of a very lame explanation of how the speaker came to issue worthless checks in payment of his honest debts, in which he was completely exposed in last week's STAR.

Seeing that his explanation was regarded as rather flimsy by the audience, he then plead for votes on the strength of his poverty, and also went on to tell how bad and how rich Congressman Cooper and Judge Van Swearingen are. He asserted that the Fayette county Judge ought to be in Penitentiary, and declared that Cooper can only win in politics by the lavish use of money. Of course, he furnished neither

proof nor convincing argument in support of his claims, and those are the essential things reasonable people usually demand.

We know of many people who are very active in supporting Mr. Cooper, and who could truthfully make oath that they are not getting a penny for the loyal support tendered that very worthy gentleman, and would not accept pay if Mr. Cooper was to tender it. Of course, all candidates are obliged to contract a certain amount of legitimate political indebtedness, and so far as we have learned, Mr. Cooper has always paid his legitimate, honest debts, whether personal or political, and he hasn't been paying them with worthless checks, either, as Mr. Likins has been doing.

The abuse aimed at Pete Livengood is not worth mentioning, and it just rolls off of Pete like water from a duck's back.

In roasting the churches, the Kentucky mutt declared that he hasn't been in church for about 20 years, because they are all too rotten, in his opinion, for a holy howler like himself to enter. He declared that all the Uniontown churches are so utterly corrupt that they are unfit for a decent man to enter, and if that's the case the Lord may one of these days send a couple of angels to urge Likins and his household to flee from that wicked place, that the wicked town may be destroyed, as was the city of Sodom after God's angels caused righteous Lot and his family to get out. But if "Windy Bill" gets a heavenly warning to get up and "dust," he must not look back, for in that event he may be transformed into a dose of salts, for he is pretty nearly that now, especially the wind part of him, which is far the greater bulk of his make-up. Well, he may not have been in church for 20 years, but we have an idea that he has not been in his right mind for a good deal longer than that.

We could go on and review the Kentucky wind-jammer's fool assertions without end, but what's the use. The game isn't worth the candle, and his street harangue attracted attention only in the same manner that a dog fight or a patent medicine fakir's guffaw would.

The Republicans organized a strong Taft, Sherman and Cooper club in a building near by, and they did it while "Windy Bill" was almost frantic with rage during his speech, in which he bitterly denounced the Salisbury Cornet Band for playing in front of Republican headquarters while he was speaking. He shouted that the band ought to quit playing out of respect for him and his meeting, but he forgets that a wind-jammer who has no more respect for himself than to be constantly abusing others should not expect others to show much respect for him. Anyway, the Republicans had as good a right to meet and organize on Wednesday night as "Windy Bill" had to speak on the street, and most of those who listened to the Kentucky freak out of curiosity, were stauncher than ever in the Republican faith after hearing his abuse, and promptly thereafter joined the Republican club.

While the band was playing in front of the Republican club room, Likins yelled, "Cooper is paying for that," and he waxed exceeding wroth. The fact is Cooper knew nothing about it, and even if he had hired the band to play for the Republicans, he would have exercised only his legitimate right. It is freely predicted that Likins will not even get the normal Prohibition vote of this county, and neither does he deserve to.
