

A Cure For Thumb Sucking.

Thumb-sucking is a habit so con mon to children that hardly any baby escapes from at least a mild attack of it. It is a perfect tyrant, once it estab-lishes itself in the nursery, and should never be allowed, even for a moment by the mother who is watchful for he child's best development. The results of thumb-sucking are usually these: Enlargement of the tonsils, protruding teeth, flat thumbs, restlessness at night, breathing through the open mouth at night, coughing, serious dis-comfort during illness, and a decided susceptibility to cold, owing to the con-stant inflammation of the tonsils which makes of them hotbeds for the growth of disease germs. If the habit is taken in time, while it is still only a tendency, it can easily be corrected by the use of mitts, sold for the purpose or made at home. If the habit has already become marked, the thumbs must be regularly painted with ox-gall or liquid quinine, the taste of which is usually sufficient to break the sold by E. H. MILLER.
