Bituminous Coal-Mining Industry in 1908—Great Decrease in Production.

Reports received by Edward W. Park, statistician of the United States Geological Survey, from State officials and others closely in touch with the coal-mining industry in the several States, indicate that the output of the bituminous coal mines of the country in 1908 was between 320,000,000 and 330,000,000 short tons. If the final returns are found to agree closely with these preliminary figures, they will indicate a decrease in production of 15 to 50 per cent, as compared with the production in 1907.

The following table gives estimated percentages of decrease in the output of the principal coal producing states:—
