He Requests Cardinal Gibbons to Do Something About the Lynching Affair.

PARIS, May 25.—A dispatch to the Figaro from Rome says the Pope has written to Cardinal Gibbons asking the latter to furnish him with details as to the New Orleans dispute, and as to its effect upon the position of Italians.

Arrested for High Treason.

PARIS, May 25.—Emile Tripone, a French artillery officer, has been arrested on a charge of high treason in being an agent of the Armstrongs, the British gun manufacturers.

The Czarevitch's Visit to Siberia.

St. Petersburg, May 25.—To celebrate the visit of the Czarevitch to Siberia, an imperial decree has been issued authorizing the Siberian Governors to remit two-thirds of the sentences and otherwise to ameliorate the condition of worthy convicts.

195 Italians Convicted.

ROME, May 25.—The result of the Mala Vita trial at Bari is that 14 have been acquitted, and 195 sentenced to terms of imprisonment ranging from six months to 15 years.

Conflict With the Portuguese.

LONDON, May 25.—The government confirms the statements as to the conflict between the British and Portuguese at Fungwe, but no details are given.

Four Persons Drowned.

LIVERPOOL, May 25.—The steamers Lestril and Mersey collided yesterday in the river Mersey and both sank, four people being drowned.

A Quarter Million Gone.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., May 25.—C. W. Scranton, of the defunct bank of Bunnell & Scranton, which closed its doors May 18, has at last vouchsafed an opinion to the anxious depositors and creditors as to the condition of affairs. He says the liabilities will reach \$400,000.

TROY, May 25.—Thomas and John Mason, brothers, while out in a row boat were capsized and drowned last evening.
