YOUNG RAUM'S CASE.

The District-Attorney to Begin Proceedings Against Him at Once.

Washington, May 25 .- Attorney-Gen eral Miller placed in the hands of Dis trict-Attorney Cole the documents having to do with the charge that Green B Raum, jr., had a man appointed to a Pension Bureau office in return for finan-cial favors. Mr. Cole later had an inter chil favors. Mr. Cole later and an inter-view with the Attorney-General, and it is understood to have been decided that proceedings against young Raum should speedily be begun. Civil Service Com-missioner Roosevelt, in communting on the Attorney-General's move, said: "We full very sure that the testimony

made out a prima facie case against the four men-Raum, Straun, Johnson and Smith-and that it was our clear duty to promptly report it, not only to the heads of departments in which the men were serving, but also to the Attorney-General for such action as he might see fit to take. The misconduct these men are alleged to be allty is of so serious a character that we could do no less. Incidentally the whole affair shows the immense benefit conferred by the civil service law in doing away with the possibility of the sale of offices; it must be remembered that the gross offence alleged was in reference to the obtaining of a place in the unclassi-fied service. Such an occurrence is not only always possible, but is always probable under the spoils system. It is impossible under ours."
