# THREE MEN KILLED.

A Coal Train Dashes Down a Mountain Hile.

ALTONNA, Pa., June 13 .-- While coming down the mountain from Lloydaville to Bellwood on the Pennsylvania & North-western Railroad at mbinight, a heavy coal train got beyond the control of the trainmen, and dashing down the grade at a fearful rate of speed, was piled up

at a fearful rate of speed, was piled up and smashed into kiniling wood at a curre on the side of a deep ravine about three miles North of Beliwood.
