After anointing and blessing the young man, the priest commanded him to walk, which, to his great delight and the amazement of the vast audience, he did, walking from the altar rail to the rear of the church unassisted. It is said that the priest physician will remain on Troy Hill until the latter part of the week.

WASHINGTON TOPICS

The New Chilian Congress Supports Balmaceda.

HE IS GIVEN UNLIMITED POWER.

Secretary Noble Returns to His Desk and Says He Will Not Resign.

President Harrison Takes a Vacation Today—He Will Spend a Few Days at His Cape May Cottage—Secretary Foster Starts for Ohio—The Report of Hypolyte's Assassination Discredited.

WASHINGTON, June 18.—The new Congress of Chili, whose members are supporting President Balmaceda, has passed several important acts since its meeting. Among other things it legalizes all the acts of the Executive and the officers of the government that may by any construction be construed contrary to the constitution.

An act has also been passed investing the President of the Republic with the following extraordinary powers during the progress of the revolution: First, he is authorized to arrest, imprison or punish any person believed to be guilty of treason, or any act tending to the overthrow of the government. He may suspend the public revenue in his judgment without being subject to estimate, and procure money upon the credit of the State without previous authority of Congress. He may declare any part of the territory of the Republic in a state of siege. He may appoint or dismiss public employes, of whatever rank or degree, without restriction. He may suspend or limit the right of public meeting and public discussion and the liberty of the press.

He may suspend the judicial power, except so far as its jurisdiction relates to civil and ordinary criminal cases. He may exempt from the jurisdiction of the tribunals of justice political cases of all kinds, and crimes growing out of the revolution. He may organize military tribunals and define their jurisdiction and authority as far as may not be contrary to law.

The government of Chili has awarded \$150,000 prize money to the commanders of the Almirante Lynch and the Almirante Cundell, the two cruisers that blew up the Blanco not long ago.
