He Was Stricken with Beart Fallure of

His Crob in Banger. Banoos, Me., July 0.-The deepest grief is fait on all sides for the loss of Bangor's foremost effices, ex-Vice-President Hars nibal Hamlin, who was stricken with heart f linre about 6 o'clock Saturday evening, while at the Tarrantice Club, and died three hours later.

He was engaged in a game of Pedro with three of his initiate friends, when one of them, Philo Strickland, noticed that Mr. Hamilin appeared mowell, and asked him if such were not the case. Mr. Hamilin replied that he was feeling very holity and leaned forward on the table. He was removed to a lonnge and asked to be obsidered up. In a short time he became unconscious. Drs. Mason, Rob-inson and Fhillips were called, and everything was done to restore the stricken man. He recurred conscious-ness at Intervale. Fire minutes before he diled the physicians and attend-ants thought he was a little improved. He remarked to the physicians: He remarked to the physicians:

"I am very warm." The physicians replied that they were

trying to make him comfortable. "But you are making me very uncom-fortable," answered Mr. Hamlin, and

five minutes later he expired. Mr. Hamlin's wife, his son, General Charles Hamlin, and wife, and their son Constiss Hamin, and wire, and their son wore present when he died. Mr. Ham-lin's death is talked of averywhere, and the groatest sympathy is expressed by everybody in the city, where he was loved by all. Shotch of the Dead Statesman's Career,

Hannibal Hamlin was born in Paris, Me., August 27, 1809, and after completing his education was admitted to the bar in 1803. Three years later the rising young lawyer was elected to the Maine Legislature, of which he was Speaker for three years. Not content with this honor, he ran for Congruss on the Demohence, he ran for Congress on the Demo-cratic ticket and was elected in 1842, re-elected in 1844, and four years after was shown to fill a vacancy in the United States Senate. In 1851 he was elected for a full term of six years. During the latter period he experienced a change of heart polltically, withdraw from his party and became a Republican. At the expi-ration of his term he was elected by the Republicans of the State Governor of Mains, but he resigned his office on being again elected Senator. again elected Senator.

In 1860, when Lincoln was elected President, Mr. Hamiin was chosen as Vice-President of the United States, and in 1805 he was appointed Collector of the Port of Boston. He soon resigned this position, however, and again went to the Senate, where he remained until 1881. In this last year he was appointed Minis-ter to Spain. After a year's service the now aged statesman concluded that he had had enough of politics. He there-upon resigned his position and retired to his home in Maine, where he had been

living quistly since. The home life of the venerable statesman was simplicity in the extreme, and his one enjoyment was superintending his little farm. He took a great interest in clubs and was a prominent member of many, but most of his evenings were spent at home. Mrs. Hamlin, who was
